
Transition Committee Survey	Name

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, we the Transition Committee of St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church, are inviting you to participate in a survey as we contemplate the future of our ministry. Our goal as a committee is to make a recommendation to the congregation about how to proceed as we prepare to search for a new pastor. While we have had some success with obtaining a part-time pastor in the past, finding another will likely be difficult due to a shortage of pastors in the area. We are exploring other options and would like your thoughts on the scenarios below. Please understand how valuable your responses will be to our process. Names will only be seen by one person of the committee — responses will essentially be anonymous. Any confirmed member of the congregation may respond — more than one response per family is encouraged. Thank you for your prayerful consideration regarding the vision and vitality of our church.

A Cooperative Ministry (multi-point parish) occurs when two or more congregations agree to remain in their existing buildings, remain separately incorporated, and share one pastor for the congregations in the co-op. Often this results in changes to worship times.

ELECTRONIC OFFERINGS

Have you considered electronic offerings? St. Paul's vendor for this service is VANCO Payment Solutions (endorsed by ELCA). We currently have a small number of members using this service. The expression "out of sight, out of mind" can apply to church offerings. Attend the service and the offering is usually dropped in the plate. Unable to attend the service and the offering is often not made or made-up.

For most members, electronic payments to public utilities or other businesses are common. With electronic offerings, you may choose the amount as well as the timing, i.e. weekly, bi-weekly, and monthly, etc. You may also determine your funding source, checking, savings, credit card. You may establish electronic offerings either directly with VANCO or through the church office. Nalani will provide you with additional information, if you so desire.
