Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

It is an exciting time to be a part of the church. I am grateful I get to spend a small portion of this time of transition with you. As we start this time together let me take a moment to introduce myself. It feels a little strange as it seems like we already know each other, but really we just know of each other. I recognize a lot of your faces and a lot of your names, but I can't necessarily put those two together and I certainly don't know most of the intertwined family tree connections so I will be needing your help and patience in putting these things together.

Many of you know that my wife is Dawn (Arndt), which means we might be related. We have two kids Andrew (3rd grade) and Delia (Kindergarten). I grew up in Minnesota, where my family continues to live. After graduating from St. Olaf College I worked as a vouth minister in CA and back in MN before starting seminary, which is where I met Dawn my final semester of classes. We are excited to be heading over to Hawaii (Dec. 31) for two weeks to visit family there.

I currently work as a librarian at Elroy Public Library, where I am fortunate to get to do Story Time every

Thursday morning. I also am an assistant track coach at Brookwood HS, working primarily with the shot put and discus athletes. Then at that time we agree to part ways with no hard feelings or we can renew the covenant depending on how things go.

Another important task is to help the congregation prepare for new settled pastor. One of the ways we will prepare is through working with council to learn more about what a healthy congregation looks like and signs of unhealth so that if the congregation should start functioning in an unhealthy way leadership can address that before it becomes a significant issue. Think of it as something like going to the dentist for a check up. We don't assume there to be any problems at the check up, but we do go just in case so that we can catch things before they become a problem.

I also expect I will wrestle with you about what it might look like for St. Paul's to be even more generous, because I believe that by building on our strengths we improve in other areas as well. When I interviewed with Council one of the questions that I asked was about what St. Paul's is good at, what they are proud of, and overwhelmingly I heard that "we're generous for a small congregation." The first challenge is to remember that it doesn't matter the size of the congregation or the community, either you are generous or you are not.

Finally, I would like to invite you to our house on February 10, 2-4 pm. Every year between Christmas and Lent Dawn and I like to invite our congregations over for an open house as a way for us to spend time with each other in a more informal, relaxed setting. We will have some treats and you are welcome to stay as long or as short as you would like. We live at 2020 Grumann Dr. in Tomah.

Merry Christmas! I look forward to getting to know one another better in the new year to come.

Bishop Arends offered the sermon on the first Sunday in Advent. Among the thoughts offered were the following.

Jesus is the Word God; the living Word of God. It is also correct to say the Word is what Christians share with one another. In fact, we as Christians must be aware that what we say is often considered the Word.

Advent is about welcoming Christ coming into our lives - each week.

As Christians, it is our responsibility not to let darkness win. Anyone who has traveled to the poor part of the world is struck by two things: the smell (like no other) and the hopelessness. Good Gifts is one way to fight against the darkness.

On Christmas Day the Gospel becomes: And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.

From December Minutes:

Interim pastor: Pastor Brad, the council and the Bishop agreed to a covenant stating that Pastor Brad will provide pastoral services to St Paul's from 12/1/17 - 8/31/17 with the option to extend this covenant if all parties agree.

Constitutional changes: D. Buchholz made a motion to change the size of the council from officers plus four to ten member to officers plus three to seven members. T Deichler 2^{nd} , all ayes, MC. T. Deichler made a motion to hold a special congregational meeting on 1/7/18 regarding the constitutional changes developed earlier this year as well as the change in council size. T. Brandau 2^{nd} , all ayes, MC.

From St. Paul's Website

Proposed Changes to St. Paul's Constitution - If you need a copy of the constitution or to review it; to the website & click the button at the bottom left.

The proposed constitution will be the sole order of business at a Special Congregational Meeting to be held on Sunday, January 7, 2018, immediately following the worship service. In accordance with Robert's Rules of Order, the Council President will call for a motion and second to adopt said constitution [as revised]. This will bring the document to the floor, to be followed by discussion. Any vote will follow the discussion. [A vote for adoption means that the revised constitution will be up for final approval at the Annual Meeting.] The ELCA provided a "model" constitution for churches to work with, and Pastor Wendland was good enough to lay our current 1994 constitution alongside the "model". From there, Dan Buchholz and Larry Ballwahn were asked by council to review, suggest, change, etc. until they came down with the finished product which was presented to council for review. The council then made the decision to present the changes to the membership. Please be aware the changes proposed are highlighted in yellow. You will also note the last constitution was adopted in November of 1994.

Thank you for taking the time to review. The current plan, provided the constitution is adopted, is to place this on the agenda of the Annual Meeting which will be held on Sunday, January 28, 2018, immediately following worship.



How Martin Luther Interpreted the Bible

. . .

He believed that the sole content of Scripture is Christ.



Christ is the incarnate Word of God, therefore the Bible can only be God's word if it deals with Christ. [2] Luther further held that "all Scripture is interpreted by its relationship to the gospel." [3] In other words, every text must be seen in light of God's redemptive work in the incarnation, life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Thus every text relates to the gospel either by promising, foreshadowing, proclaiming, or reflecting upon the person and work of Christ. The modern interpreter is helped by Luther's [view] because the gospel is timeless. Since Christ lived, died, and rose for believers past, present, and future, the gospel is immediately applicable to the modern reader. The gospel, therefore, is the applicational bridge from the ancient text to the modern reader.
