On the local level, St. Paul's has a considerable history. Nalani has detailed the Blood Drive's past. The Food Pantry has a similar story. Started as an outreach of all of the Wilton Churches, all still contribute. For whatever reason, the operation has been the responsibility of St. Paul's for a number of years. Arlis Ballwahn was the Coordinator for 15 years when the Pantry was located in the Bank Basement, Upon her retirement, Lorrie Bever has undertaken the role and contributed the article that follows.

St. Paul's Community Outreach

ST. PAUL'S FOOD PANTRY

St. Paul's Food Pantry continues to serve many needy families in the Wilton area. Over the last two years we have had over sixty different families visit the pantry, and about thirty of these families use it regularly. All are welcome to use the pantry once a month, but in times of need they may visit more often. The pantry has been located in many different places over the years, but our present location in the Wilton Community Center seems to be the perfect spot. It is handicapped accessible which allows many people to visit the pantry who were unable to do so in the past.

The pantry is extremely thankful to all the people in the Wilton area who regularly donate food and money. We are especially grateful for St. Paul's continuous support. Without your help, the pantry would not be the success that it is.

Wilton Community Blood Drive

St. Paul's Social Ministry Committee hosted the first blood drive in October, 1996. This undertaking was spearheaded by Gina Rae and Beth Dibbert. What began as an annual event changed in 2002 when the Red Cross asked if we would be willing to host a drive every 8-10 weeks. The logic was simple. Regular drives translate into regular donors, rather than a hit and miss here and there. It took awhile to figure out the best day and time, but before long we decided Saturday morning worked the best.

The drives were initially held in the church basement but, happily, we outgrew the space!! In fact, one Saturday morning it looked like we were going to have to send folks up into the sanctuary to wait their turn!! We now hold our drives at the Wilton Community Center.

The Red Cross website has our statistics from 2008 forward. In that time, we have hosted 78 drives and collected 3,833 units. One unit of blood has the potential to help save 3 lives. Do the math.....our donors have helped to save 11,499 lives.

Did you know only 3% of the eligible donors actually take the time, an hour or so, to fill this vital need? We need to continually add to our donor list because, for a variety of reasons, folks have to defer from donating. Medications and health issues are two reasons. We have worked with the Brookwood High School FFA in hopes of reaching out to students and helping to establish them as regular donors. But, remember when you were in high school? Did you want to drag yourself out of bed on Saturday morning for any reason? Times have not changed!! We will, however, keep holding joint drives and eventually they'll understand the importance of becoming a regular donor.

On a personal note; having received 5 units when our daughter Ann was born, if I could track those 5 people down I would give them the biggest hug. Without the blood transfusion the Doctor made it very clear to Greg I would likely have died. My family knows first hand the blessing of blood donors. You, no doubt, know someone who also benefited from the gift of blood.

Our next drive is June 15 from 7:00 AM- 11:30 AM. If you are a blood donor now, bring a friend, or two or three. If you've never made a blood donation, there is no time like the present to start your journey. We promise a time of community fellowship along with a great breakfast. In return, you will have helped save a life.

Memorial Day or Decoration Day as many folks call it, is just around the corner. Flowers will soon be appearing on and around the graves.


The Cemetery Committee requests flowers be placed either on the tombstone itself or above the ground on posts. Flowers placed in the ground require the groundskeeper to stop,
