

Letter of May 6

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I have been thinking a lot about our children and youth these days. They are missing out on Sunday School, Confirmation, in-person school and school-related activities, spring sports, chess tournaments, prom, choir and band concerts; scholarship, honor society and graduation events. Many of these things must be hard for them to miss. They are events and activities that most of us were able to enjoy when we were young. Yet this year, if they are happening at all, they are happening virtually or in some social-distancing format.

Confirmation Sunday has been postponed, too. This is always a very special worship service/celebration for the confirmands and the entire assembly. In addition to church members attending worship on Confirmation Sunday, many extended family members and guests join us on that day. Partly because we will certainly go over the maximum number of 50-persons gathered, Confirmation Sunday has been moved to October 31, 2020 (Reformation Sunday).

Our four eighth graders, and one sixth grader in Confirmation have worked very hard this year. They have completed homework assignments on the Book of Genesis and the curriculum for the Old Testament. They have memorized the books of the Old Testament, "The Lord's Prayer," "The Apostles' Creed," "The Ten Commandments" and several Bible verses. They have met via phone or online formats with their mentors and participated in service projects. I hope you will join me in thanking them and their mentors Ayawyn Conner (Carolyn Dougherty, mentor), Vanessa Anderson (Sarah Gruen, mentor), Marah Gruen (Ann Anderson, mentor), Bria Gruen (Joel Arndt, mentor) and Brooklyn Gruen (Lori Arndt, mentor). The mentors' weekly meetings with their mentees during the Lenten Season helped the Confirmation students to understand "The Ten Commandments" in greater detail.

I have heard that some of our children and youth have been coloring or drawing pictures during this time of Safer-At-Home. I would like to invite them to share some of their artwork with us! If any of the children and youth have created pictures showing what they have been doing during this time, please send a copy to Nalani at the church office, or take a photo (or have your parent take a photo) of your drawing and email it to the church email address. We will share some of the pictures with others in the congregation. If you have not created any artwork and would like to have a subject, you are welcome to read an upcoming gospel passage and create a drawing or coloring about that passage that we can send with the weekly bulletin.

We are thankful for all of our young people and hope that in this time, you will not only feel the love of your immediate family but your church family, too.
