La Crosse Synod Congregational Hunger Leaders

Job Description

In a 2017 Resolution, the La Crosse Area Synod agreed to establish a network of Hunger Leaders from each congregation which will work with the Hunger Subcommittee and pastors. We have updated the job description to give you a better picture of what Hunger Leaders are asked to do.

World Hunger Leaders in the congregations should be willing to:

- Serve for at least one year. (We encourage you to set up a committee to work with you!)
- Attend training and resource workshops sponsored by the Synod Hunger Subcommittee. (These are usually held twice a year - in early fall and then again during the winter or early spring.)
- Receive and share resources from ELCA World Hunger and the Synod with your pastor and congregation.
- Assist your congregation and pastor in planning and carrying out a World Hunger emphasis to fit your church.

This could include doing such things as: Sponsoring a World Hunger Sunday. Setting up a Giving Tree at Christmas time using the Good Gifts catalog from ELCA Hunger. Collecting “noisy offerings” for hunger. Displaying and updating an educational bulletin board on Hunger. Using ELCA Hunger Advent and Lenten resources. Using ELCA Hunger VBS materials. Invite a resource person to speak on Hunger.

School supplies are now in stores at discounted prices!! The following are the necessary supplies needed for the backpacks (provided):

- FOUR 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper, approximately 8" x 10 ½"; no loose leaf paper
- ONE 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- ONE pencil sharpener
- ONE pair of **blunt tipped** scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- FIVE unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- FIVE black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- ONE box of 16 or 24 crayons
- ONE 2 ½" eraser

¹³All of these died in faith without having received the promises, but from a distance they saw and greeted them.
