As we look to this weekend and the start of June, there are three events that I would like to highlight for you to consider attending! All events take place this Saturday (June 5). One is in Wilton, and the other two are but a short drive from Wilton.

Saturday morning is the **Blood Drive** at the Wilton Community Center. If you are a regular blood donor, thank you! If you have never given blood, or have not given in some time, this Saturday would be a wonderful time to begin or renew your commitment. There is a great need for blood right now! Please donate and give the gift of life.

Also, Saturday morning is the **Dairy Breakfast** that kicks off "June Dairy Month." The Monroe County event will take place at MDS Dairy (9314 Kansas Avenue, Sparta). The breakfast begins at 7 a.m. and runs to 11 a.m. It features the following menu--Ham and Cheese Omelet, pancakes, Culver's strawberry sundaes (donations encouraged to support local FFA chapters), donut holes, cookies, buttered toast, cheese, coffee and milk. Cost is \$5.00 per person, \$3.00 (ages 6-10), with children 5 and under, free.

This year, **COVID-19 vaccinations will be available at the Dairy Breakfast**. If you have not yet had your shot(s), this would be an easy way for you to get yours! Please do so for the safety and well-being of your family members, friends, fellow church members, and others in our local communities.

The Dairy Breakfast Opening Ceremony will begin at 8:30 a.m. During the event, there will be educational displays, children's activities, dairy farm viewing, an antique tractor display, horse drawn wagon rides, and an animal education area. Also this Saturday, the **Friends of the Kickapoo Valley Reserve (KVR)** are having a special event-- "**Dawn Through Dark National Trails Day**." There will be guided and self-guided hikes at designated times. The guided hikes include: bird walks, hike/play for families with young children, local history, Llama trekking, a leisurely walk to favorite KVR spots, a way-finding adventure for families with older children, hikin' with lichens, saving our diversity: identifying invasives, and a night walk at 8:15 p.m. (For a full listing of times, go online to [kickapoofriends.org](http://kickapoofriends.org).)

There will also be live music from 11 a.m.-2 p.m. (A bring-your-own-blanket picnic will be held by the Visitor's Center. Brats and other food will be available for purchase during these times.)
